



# Two decades of togetherness

#### **HISTORY! Michael Brumby**

THE first Get to Know Your Community Day took place in Lissner Park on Father's Day in

Tina Ramsay (a TAFE student on placement at CTNC) organised the event. Groups that participated

included the QCWA, Life Education, Youth Achievement Australia, Gold City Lions, Blue Nurses and the Fire Brigade.

Three years later the event was co-opted by the organisers of the Centenary of Federation celebrations as a "fitting finale" to their Federation Celebrations in the city.

The invasion of bats into Lissner Park forced the Community Day to move to Centenary Park in 2003, with stall numbers having grown to

Six years later stall numbers had more than doubled to 140. Of these 60 were local community organisations.

By this time the day was put back to the Sunday before

Father's Day.

In 2007 a "Blueprint for the Bush: Our Place, Our Future" submission funded the involvement of young people.

They hosted a range of activities including egg and spoon races, sack races, basketball, football, volleyball, and other novelty events.

"Rock the Park' was organised by Jacqui Maslem (then-Charters Towers City Council youth development officer), local musician Ernie Wheeler, Youth Towers and many other local

young people. Four local bands and a Townsville band entertained a large crowd with heavy metal and rock.

As Tracey Jones lamented in 2009: "In the first few years there was confusion over who was responsible for coordinating the day. But now I think people know it is the Charters Towers Neighbourhood Centre's event".

"Today it is regarded as a major strategy in promoting the Neighbourhood Centre's organisational identity."
